



'The Siding' Cabernet Sauvignon

Wynns Coonawarra Estate was the first winery to be established in Coonawarra by John Riddoch in 1896. The winery is located on the world-famous strip of 'Terra Rossa' soil that produces fruit with exceptional quality.

The wine is named after the railway siding - a local landmark that played a defining role during Coonawarra's early settlement. Completed in 1898, 'The Siding' was responsible for transporting around 600 hogsheads of wine a year to Adelaide.

The Siding delivers varietal and regional character that is approachable on release, yet will still develop with short to medium-term cellaring.

Maturation:

11 months maturation using a combination of French oak planks and seasoned French oak barrels.

Colour:

Dark purple core with a vibrant plum hue

Nose

Engaging ripe cherries and brambles are elevated by savoury lavender and spice.

Palate:

Youthful and alluring, with a plush, almost bright texture. Dark berries are enveloped in cedar, earthy and spice.

The structure is classic Cabernet, malleable tannins follow the contours of the palate creating a seamless profile, balanced with fresh acid.

Cellaring:

Enjoy on release or cellar carefully for up to 7 years
