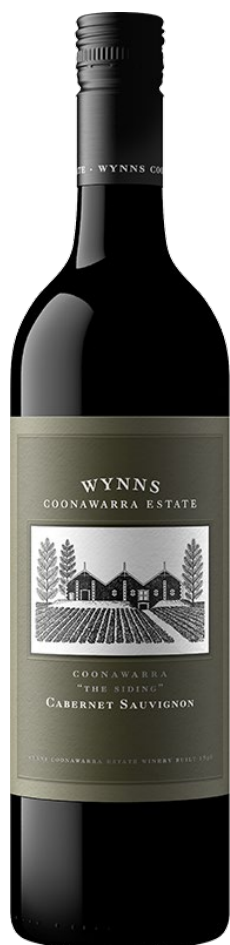

'The Siding' Cabernet Sauvignon 2019

Wynns Coonawarra Estate was the first winery to be established in Coonawarra by John Riddoch in 1896. The winery is located on the world-famous strip of 'Terra Rossa' soil that produces fruit with exceptional quality.

The wine is named after the railway siding - a local landmark that played a defining role during Coonawarra's early settlement. Completed in 1898, 'The Siding' was responsible for transporting around 600 hogsheads of wine a year to Adelaide.

The Siding delivers varietal and regional character that is approachable on release yet will still develop with short to medium-term cellaring.

Region: Coonawarra

Grape Variety: Cabernet Sauvignon

Harvest date: April 2019

2019 vintage conditions:

Good winter rains leading into the growing season, with a cool and dry April harvesting season. Cabernets expressed deep and rich colour, great flavour expression of the varietal, and soft tannin structure.

Alcohol: 13.6%

Technical Analysis:

RS <0.5 (dry), pH 3.67, TA 5.7g/L

Maturation:

11 months maturation using a combination of French oak planks and seasoned French oak barrels.

Colour:

Dark purple core with a vibrant plum hue

Nose:

Classic fresh aromatics of blackberry and mint accentuated by subtle dried herb perfumes of lavender and white sage.

Palate:

Fine, long and generous. Buoyant red cherry and plum leads to deeper contrasting notes of moss and earth. The wine is enhanced with soft but succulent acid, fine cedary oak and elegant malleable tannin, finishing with a hint of thyme. One for your Sunday lamb roast.

Cellaring:

Enjoy on release or cellar carefully for up to 7 years
